Jasmine Langevine has contributed to women’s economic empowerment in her community and outside the corporate world by teaching financial literacy to hundreds of college students and community members, serving as a career counselor and public speaker on career development/progression and executive producing the entrepreneurship interview series “Footprints to Fruition”.

Over the past decade Jasmine has taught financial literacy through the non-profit organization The Economic Empowerment Initiative, Inc. to hundreds of community members and students at over 15 colleges and universities nationally; topics included Saving, Investing, Credit & Debt, Homeownership and more. Jasmine also focused on women’s economic empowerment and taught courses at women’s colleges including her alma mater, Agnes Scott College, Spelman College (both in Atlanta, GA) and Mills College in Oakland, CA.

Through her organization, Career Conversations, Jasmine provides career counseling to young professionals and speaks on panels about internship readiness, talent management best practices and effective networking.
